*This analysis represents the findings of a survey of 1,000 voters in the United States representing the likely November general electorate. The survey used a registration-based sample, with interviews conducted via landline, cell, and text-to-online from August 6-12, 2024. The margin of error is +/-3.1% overall at a 95% level of confidence (higher for subgroups).*

Americans favor a strong U.S.-Israel relationship and want their candidates, and their country, to support Israel. Pro-Israel candidates fare better with voters than those with anti-Israel views. Voters want continued U.S. support for Israel, including security assistance, and they reject the idea of an arms embargo. They also want the Democratic platform to remain pro-Israel and a ceasefire only when Hamas is dismantled, and the hostages are returned.

**Being Pro-Israel Is A Vote Getter For Democrats**

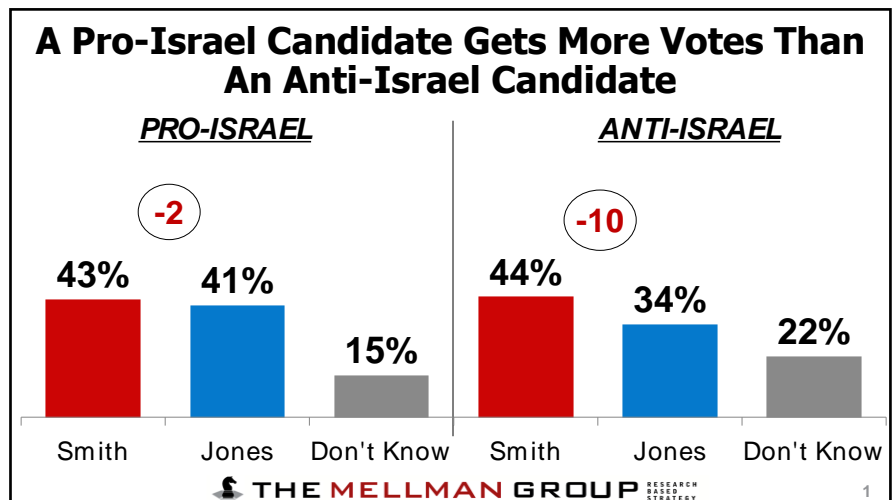
We employed the “gold standard” test, an experimental design, to assess the impact of a candidate’s Israel stance on their vote share.

The whole sample heard about a Candidate Smith with a Republican oriented message<sup>1</sup>. Everyone also heard about Candidate Jones with a typical Democratic message.

The sample was then divided in half, at random, with one half hearing that Jones supported a strong U.S.-Israel relationship while the other half was told Jones “opposes a strong U.S.-Israel relationship...”<sup>2</sup>.

The results were clear and compelling. The pro-Israel Jones is just 2-points behind Smith, while the anti-Israel Jones lags 10-points behind Smith.

In short, a pro-Israel candidate does 8-points better than an anti-Israel candidate.



## Voters Want The U.S. To Support Israel

This strong advantage for a pro-Israel candidate is not surprising given voters' own support for the Jewish state, which is evident across a range of survey questions.

Sixty-two percent (62%) of voters have a favorable view of Israel, while just 24% have an unfavorable opinion, nearly identical to the 62% favorable, 25% unfavorable we recorded in December 2023.

Voters in the seven battleground states<sup>3</sup>, are even more positive with 67% expressing favorable views of Israel and just 17% unfavorable.

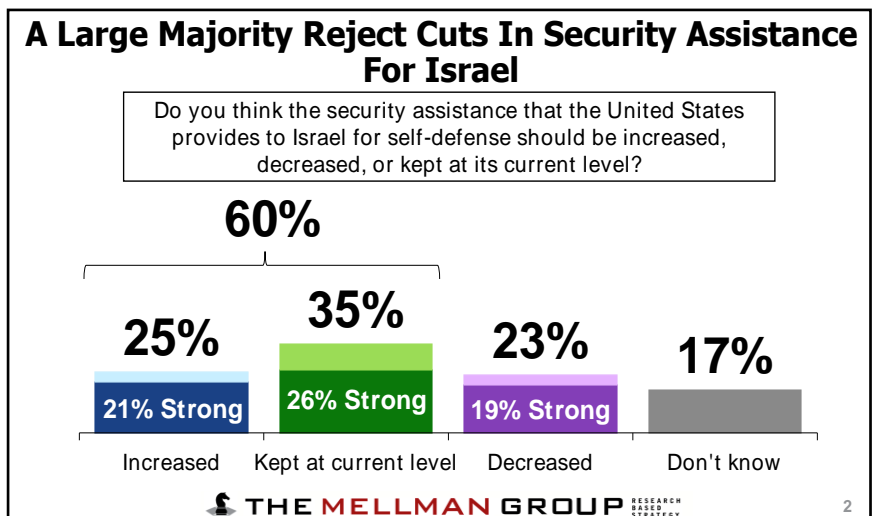
That presents a sharp contrast to voters' negative assessments of The Palestinian Authority, which is seen favorably by just 15%, compared to 49% who are unfavorable. Hamas garners unfavorable ratings from a vast 82% and favorables from a mere 4%.

Among voters in battleground states, 17% have a favorable view of The Palestinian Authority and 35% have an unfavorable view. In those same states, Hamas garners unfavorable ratings from a vast 79% and favorables from a mere 2%.

So, it is not surprising that 70% of voters nationwide want the U.S. to support Israel in the current conflict, while just 5% would prefer America support Hamas. Among Democrats, 62% believe the U.S. should support Israel, while only 7% prefer the U.S. support Hamas. Over two-thirds of voters in battleground states (68%) want U.S. support for Israel, while just 3% prefer the U.S. back Hamas.

That support extends to the military aid provided to Israel by the U.S. Only 23% of voters nationally want security assistance decreased from current levels, while 60% want it increased or kept the same, and 17% offer no opinion.

Over half of Democrats (53%) want security aid increased or kept the same, while just 30% support a cut and 17% have no opinion. Among voters in battleground states, a lesser 17% favor decreasing security assistance from current levels, while 66% want it increased or kept the same, and 18% offer no opinion.



Voters recognize Israel's defensive aims and Hamas' genocidal goals.

Just 20% believe Israel's goal is "to kill as many Palestinians as possible and annex Gaza and the West Bank into Israel." Sixty-four percent (64%) take the position that Israel's goal is "to dismantle and disarm Hamas, to free the hostages and to prevent future attacks against Israel."

Among Democrats, 28% believe Israel's goal is killing and annexation, while twice as many (55%) say Israel aims to dismantle Hamas. Only 13% of voters in battleground states believe Israel's goal is offensive while 67% believe Israel aims to disarm Hamas.

Forty-nine percent (49%) of Democrats believe Hamas' goal is "to destroy Israel..." Twenty-nine percent (29%) believe Hamas intends "a two-state solution..." Among voters in battleground states, 59% believe Hamas' goal is "to destroy Israel" whereas just 17% think Hamas intends "to end up with a two-state solution..."

### **Voters Want A Pro-Israel Platform**

We read voters a draft of the 2024 platform on Israel<sup>4</sup> and asked how they might want it changed. In short, strong majorities want a platform at least as pro-Israel as the current version, and not more pro-Palestinian.

Nationally, only 22% want the platform to be less "pro-Israel," while 67% want to keep it as is or made more pro-Israel. In response to a separate question, just 20% want the platform to be more "pro-Palestinian" with 65% wanting either the current version or a document that is less "pro-Palestinian."

Just 28% of Democrats opt for a platform that is less "pro-Israel" while 61% prefer keeping the platform as it is or making it more pro-Israel. Thirty-two percent (32%) of Democrats want the platform to be more "pro-Palestinian" with 56% preferring either the current version or a platform that's less "pro-Palestinian."

In battleground states, 15% want a less "pro-Israel" platform, while 71% favor keeping the platform as it is or making it more pro-Israel. Seventeen percent (17%) in these swing states want the platform to be more "pro-Palestinian" with 66% opting for either the current version or a document that's less "pro-Palestinian."

## Voters Support A Ceasefire Only After Hamas Is Defeated And Hostages Are Returned

Thirty percent (30%) of voters across the country believe Israel should agree to “an immediate, permanent ceasefire,” while 56% take the position that “Israel should only agree to a ceasefire with Hamas after Hamas has been disarmed and dismantled and the hostages they took are released.”

Among voters in battleground states, 27% said Israel should agree to “an immediate, permanent ceasefire,” while 55% believe Israel should only agree to a ceasefire after Hamas has been disarmed, dismantled, and the hostages released.
